


The following tax corrections were presented by Assessor Robinson and approved by a majority vote:

Commissioner Meeting November 5, 2019

The regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners was brought to order by Chairman, William J Novotny, III at 9:00am on Tuesday November 5, 2019. Attending were Commissioners Linda Greenough and Robert Perry, Commissioner's Assistant Sheila Newcomb, County Clerk Vicki Edelman and Deputy County Attorney Barry Crago.

Perry moved to approve the minutes of the October 15, 2019 regular meeting. Greenough seconded, motion carried. County Attorney Tucker Ruby gave his year in review report to the Commissioners.

Greenough moved to authorize Chairman Novotny to sign the Cooperative Agreement between the Wyoming Department of Transportation and the Johnson County Commission to allow participation in the hot plant mix overlay of .7 miles on Hazelton Road with a total cost to Johnson County of \$150,610.00. Perry seconded, motion carried. Also discussed with Scott Pehringer Road & Bridge Supervisor were traffic counts on Deadhorse and Schoonover roads in Johnson County, Airport parking lot, upcoming county road repair and reconstruction and preparation of an agreement with WYDOT to plow the parking lot on Hazelton Road.

Sylvia Bruner Director of the Jim Gatchell Museum along with Bill Payne and Sharon Miller Board Members met with the Commissioners to give their year in review report.

Kelly Norris and Jacob McCarthey with State Forestry met with the Commissioners to give updates on the Western Spruce Budworm problems in the southern Big Horn Mountains. They reported this is an intensifying epidemic and affects all sizes of the Douglas Fir Trees; reportedly 12,000 acres in 2019 on State, Private, USFS and BLM lands in the southern Big Horn Mountains. They have completed thinning projects on private and state land and are working on commercial timber sales in the affected areas.

The following tax corrections as presented by Assessor Robinson were approved by a majority vote of County Commission:
#3059 Prima Exploration Inc, 2019 tax year, refund amount \$1,746.73; #3060 Anadarko E&P Onshore, LLC, 2017 tax year, refund amount \$4,077.08; #3061 Anschutz Exploration, 2016 tax year, refund amount \$2,796.56.

Paul Demple Chief Executive Officer for Northern Wyoming Mental Health and acting County Manager Jennifer White met with the Commissioners to give a report on the status of operations in Johnson County, Buffalo and Kaycee. Paul Demple reported that they are moving forward with the IOP between the Johnson County Sheriff's Office, NWMH and the Dept of Corrections for the jail compliance. He also reported they have several upcoming interviews for replacement of the open positions in Johnson County. They have hired a firm to help with recruitment and a consultant to help understand the cultural issues. Chairman Novotny commented they need discussion on their staffing issues and need to understand skyping is not acceptable for participation in drug court; also saying maybe they need to look at contracting with local people who can focus on the community mental health as well as for Kaycee. Susan Carr, Director for Compass Centers for Families said their service to clients in Sheridan was excellent but the families they serve in Johnson County have no help with mental health
