

Commissioner Meeting November 4, 2020

The regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners was brought to order by Chairman William J. Novotny III, at 9:00 am on Wednesday, November 4, 2020. Attending were Commissioners Linda Greenough and Robert Perry, Commissioner's Assistant Sheila Newcomb, County Attorney Tucker Ruby and County Clerk, Vicki Edelman. This meeting was held electronically via "Go to Meeting" for public access and participation. This meeting date was changed by Resolution #649.

Perry moved to approve the minutes of the October 20, 2020 regular meeting. Greenough seconded; motion carried.

Greenough moved to authorize Chairman Novotny to sign the MOU between the Wyoming Guardian Ad Litem and Johnson County, Wyoming from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2022. Perry seconded; motion carried.

Perry moved to authorize Chairman Novotny to sign the Amendment One to the MOU between Wyoming Dept of Health, Public Health and Johnson County. Greenough seconded; motion carried.

Greenough moved to certify the mineral expense, for the quarter, charged to the districts in the amount of \$14,641.65. Perry seconded; Motion carried.

Greenough moved to appoint Kimberly G Harvey to the unexpired City/County position on the Recycle board. Perry seconded; motion carried.

Greenough moved to authorize Chairman Novotny to sign the MOU between Johnson County and the Johnson County Prevention Council beginning July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2022. Perry seconded; motion carried.

Greenough moved to authorize Chairman Novotny to approve and sign Tax Reduction #3092, 2020 Tax Year, Acct #R0009497 in the amount of \$721.01 and #3092, 2020 Tax Year, Acct #R0001684 in the amount of \$377.03. Perry seconded; motion carried.

Chairman Novotny reported the Natural Resource Plan is ready for the public hearing process and will be adopted at the November 17th meeting.

After discussion between County Attorney Tucker Ruby, Deputy County Attorney Barry Crago, the Commissioners and Cheryl Benner; Perry moved to use the "stepped approach" which leaves the concrete ramp in place for now and allow the Attorneys to work out some type of agreement. Greenough seconded for discussion purposes. Chairman Novotny said the concrete ramp needs to be on the tax roll. The vote was called for; Perry-Yes; Greenough-No; Novotny-Yes; motion carried. Chairman Novotny and Attorney Ruby both stated this does not forfeit the County's position, the boat ramp is not grand-fathered and any further work in the area will be a breach.

Greenough moved to approve the October vouchers in the amount of \$608,577.79. Perry seconded; motion carried.

After calling for public comment; Kent Waugh asked for updates on Hazelton Road. Chairman Novotny said the boulders on the perimeter of the parking lot will be marked; the piles of gravel or road-base will stay in the county right of way for economic reasons; the same signage as in the past will be up for the road closure and WYDOT will move the snow to a different area. Deputy County Barry Crago said there is no written plan in place just the Statute which allows for emergency closure of county roads and the public is given notice.
