


Commissioner Meeting March 16, 2021

The regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners was brought to order by Chairman William J Novotny, III at 9:00am on Tuesday March 16, 2021. Attending were Commissioners Linda Greenough and Robert Perry, Commissioner's Assistant Sheila Newcomb, County Clerk Vicki Edelman, and County Attorney Tucker Ruby. This meeting was held via "Go to Meeting" for public access and participation as well as in person.

Perry moved to approve the minutes of the March 2, 2021 regular meeting. Greenough seconded; motion carried.

The Commissioners met with Scott Pehringer Road and Bridge Supervisor and Cheryl Benner Lake DeSmet Operations Supervisor to discuss the Lake DeSmet Advisory Board openings. Cheryl Benner gave information on the formation of the Board. Commissioner Perry is very opposed to the fact that Sheridan County residents would be appointed to this board since Johnson County does own the lake and Johnson County residents should be making those decisions. After further discussion, Greenough moved to re-appoint Joe Kalus to the recreation position for a 2-year term. Perry seconded; motion carried. Greenough moved to appoint Nathan Lindsey to the environmental position for a 2-year term. Novotny seconded. Chairman Novotny called for the vote: Greenough-yes; Perry-No; Novotny-yes; motion carried. Greenough moved to ratify Sheridan County's appointment of Bob Ralston (Sheridan County Commissioner's appointment); Novotny seconded. Again, Chairman Novotny called for the vote: Greenough-yes; Perry-No; Novotny-yes; motion carried.

Greenough moved to lift the hiring freeze and allow Road & Bridge to hire an operator. Perry seconded; motion carried.

After discussion on the fee schedule at Mikesell Potts; Perry moved to increase the fees for camping at Mikesell Potts. Greenough seconded; motion carried. It was also reported that now sales tax and lodging tax will be collected at Mikesell Potts.

After discussion with Planner Waller on the Hamersma Minor Subdivision (1 lot) Final Plat, Perry moved to approve and authorize Chairman Novotny to sign the Hamersma Minor Subdivision Final Plat. Greenough seconded; motion carried.

Greenough moved to authorize Chairman Novotny to sign the Bomber Mountain Civic Center Shelter Plan MOU between Johnson County and KBJ Economic Development JPB. Perry seconded; motion carried.

Greenough moved to allocate \$100,000.00 to the 1% Committee for the county's share for the 2021-2022 FY. Perry seconded; motion carried.

Perry moved to authorize Chairman Novotny to sign #3094, reduction of the 2020 tax roll Acct #R0002299 in the amount of \$1,548.12. Greenough seconded; motion carried.


Perry moved to authorize Chairman Novotny to sign the Modification of Grant Agreement between the Johnson County Sheriff and the US Forest Service in the amount of \$4,000 for the 21-22FY. Greenough seconded; motion carried. Sheriff Odenbach reported this money will be used for extra patrol in the Big Horn National Forest.

Perry moved to lift the hiring freeze and allow the Sheriff's office to hire. Greenough seconded; motion carried. Other items discussed with the Commissioners were the set-up of the Sheriff's Foundation which is a 501-C3 and will be able to accept donations, the possibility of a grant-funded vehicle and a grant-funded vest for Lucy.

Trish Thompson Public Health Nurse Manager met with the Commissioners to give updates on where Johnson County is with the vaccinations and an overall review of the COVID-19 year in the Public Health Office. Both nurses will be leaving the public health office the first part of April.

Greenough moved to authorize Chairman Novotny to sign the Amendment #1 to the MOU between Wyoming Dept of Health and Johnson County for the 2-year award period in the amount of \$12,271.00 for MCH and \$3,600.00 for the TANF. Perry seconded; motion carried.

There being no public comment the regular meeting was adjourned at 11:00am.
