

The Johnson County Sheriff's Office recognizes it needs to take certain precautions to limit the exposure of our staff, individuals in our custody, and the public to the COVID-19 virus. Our Office will stay operational in both criminal and administrative capacities.

The administrative division will temporarily make the following changes:

- Applications for New Concealed Carry Permits will not be accepted. Please call about Renewal Applications for Concealed Carry Permit.
- Sex Offender Registration. Please call before reporting for verifications or to make changes.
- Paper Service will continue as needed.
- Notary Services will still be available. Monday – Friday from 8:00 am – 5:00 pm.

The Johnson County Detention Center has made the following changes:

- Contact visits between inmates and non-essential personnel have been suspended. AA meetings, Church Services, and Ministerial Visits will be conducted through our video visitation system.
- Mental Health Counselors and attorneys can meet with our inmates through glass partitioned visitation booths. Video and phone conferencing are also available.
- Public Fingerprinting has been suspended.
- Public Notary Services will not be handled by Detention Staff.
- No tours of the facility

We will keep you updated if our procedures change, and let you know when we are able to return to normal operations.
